

Keep me at home if...

- I have a temperature higher than 100 degrees even after taking medicine.
- I'm throwing up or have diarrhea.
- My eyes are pink and crusty.


Concepts and Skills being covered and how you can help!


ELA- Please practice letter sounds. Have your child find something in your house that starts with certain sounds!

Math-Positional words such as between, in front of, behind, above, under and beside. Students can practice putting their toys in different words using these positional words.

Science- We are beginning to learn about Spring and growing plants.

Independent Skills- Begin practicing tying shoes. Please continue to practice opening packages and containers.





KINDERGARTEN UPDATES


Standards being covered and how you can support your learner at home!

ELA- Review main idea and key details, long and short vowels, prefixes, affixes, rhyming words, clapping out syllables and letter sound correspondence with say it, map it, write it

Math- Counting objects, up to 20, to identify how many objects are in a group

Science- Identify items in the day and night sky


Social Studies- making positive choices



FIRST GRADE UPDATES

Standards being covered and how you can support your learner at home!

- Reading: retell stories including key details; use illustrations and details to describe character, setting, plot; author's purpose; and recall main idea and key details.
- Grammar: conjunctions, simple and compound sentences, and capitalization.
- Math: read and write numbers to 120; addition and subtraction; ten more, ten less; greater than, less than; base 10 blocks to model addition and subtraction. Review time to the hour and half hour and money: recognize coins and their value.
- Science: plants and animals
- Social Studies: historical figures; scarcity; producers/consumers
- *** the best way to support your child's learning is to ask them questions daily about what they are learning and look at the work that goes home in the Wednesday folder. Also, READ. READ. READ.



THIRD GRADE UPDATES

Standards being covered and how you can support your learner at home!

Math

- * Telling time to the nearest minute, quarter hour; elapsed time.
- * Fractions Unit fractions, fractions as a whole/set, and comparing. They will need to understand how to determine if fractions are equivalent
 - when using a number line, area models, & fraction strips. We encourage your student to use IXL and Happy Numbers at home via Launch
 - Pad. (Contact teacher for details.).

Health

- * Reliable Resources What are resources students can utilize to make healthy and informed decisions? Students will be able to identify
 - trustworthy resources and justify their thinking.


Science

ELA:

Our focus will be on:

- 1. Determine the main idea of a text and supporting details
- 2. Ask and answer questions to demonstrate understanding of a text
- 3. Write narratives to include dialogue



FOURTH GRADE UPDATES

<u>Math</u>:

- 4.NR.5 Solve real-life problems involving addition, equivalence, comparison of fractions with denominators of 10 and 100, and comparison of decimal numbers as tenths and hundredths using part-whole strategies and visual models.
- Please talk with your scholar about fractions. Share what you know with them. Also, work on mastering all multiplication and division facts through 12X12 or 144/12=12

<u>ELA</u>:

- ELAGSE4R3,4,10 Theme, Ordering Adjectives, Inferences and Opinion Writing
- Encourage daily reading. Practice typing a summary of what is read.

<u>Science</u>:

• S4P3 Force and Motion, balanced and unbalanced forces, simple machines *Social Studies*:

• SS4H3, SS4G1 Western expansion, Oregon Trail, Gold Rush

FIFTH GRADE UPDATES Math- 5th grade will be adding, subtracting, rounding, and converting decimals. **How to Help at Home-** Please help students with decimals at home! **Reading-Science-** 5th grade will be working on Cells and Microorganisms (beneficial and harmful), and Classification of plants and animals. You can help at home by allowing them to research beneficial microorganisms that are used to produce foods, as well as harmful microorganisms such as bacteria and viruses. Social Studies- Students will continue learning about World War II. This will include an informational essay on an important event from this period. **Help with S.S at home:** Encourage students to try their best with the upcoming writing assignment! It is wondeful practice for the Georgia Milestones and beyond!
